These flows resulted from a large number of catch basins, roofleader discharges and cistern overflows being connected to the sanitary sewerage system. It is also apparent that there are sewers which permit gross infiltrations.

A list of possible projects for consideration under the Public Works Reserve Projects was presented and discussed.

The Superintendent reported that the services of Mr. Frank Gmeiner, clerk and laboratory assistant have proven satisfactory and the Commission authorized that Mr. Gmeiner be paid at the rate of \$100.00 per month effective July 1, 1942.

The Commission authorized an insurance premium of \$261.20 for workman's compensation for the period July 1, 1942 to July 1, 1943.
